General Fund income was \$10,527.37 and expenses \$10,546.97 for a net (-) \$19.60

For the year:

General Fund income was \$117,100.26 and expenses \$130,159.81 for a net (-) \$13,059.55

Our investment income (not General Fund) did well for the month to help shore up our reserves. December figures are looking promising. Our congregation is full of faithful and generous people, and we do appreciate everything that each one does to help keep the lights on and continue our important ministry! Thank you to those who were able to include their year-end giving!
